



**Allendale, Inc. Survey: US Producers Report Slightly Lower Yields for Corn and Soybeans**

CHICAGO, IL. (September 4, 2019) – Allendale, Inc. a Chicago area agricultural commodity brokerage and analysis firm suggests a projected US corn crop of 13.755 billion bushels and a soybean crop of 3.499 billion bushels.

The 30<sup>th</sup> annual Nationwide Producer Yield Survey was conducted from August 19 - 30. The surveys were conducted direct by our brokers (56%) as well as via our website and social media platforms (44%).

These estimates were based on producer calculated yields in 29 states. Ample surveys gave us the numbers needed to project yields in the top 12 states. This covers 86% of corn production and 83% of soybean production. For this survey, the smaller states were assumed using USDA’s August 12 estimates. Harvested acres were assumed using USDA’s August 12 estimates. *No adjustments for maturity concerns were made.*
